(Honours) with syllabus designed to ensure students can face their chartered accountancy exams with ease, here on Friday.

College president Karumuttu T. Kannan said that the course was planned, syllabus decided and approvals sought within a period of three months.

“Accountants will have no dearth of opportunities if they pay close attention to the curriculum,” he said.

The scope for commerce education and the students applying to these courses had increased marginally, according to secretary Karumuttu T. Thiagarajan.

He added that commerce students with good skill sets will be handsomely rewarded due to the high demand for good chartered accountants.

Principal D. Pandiaraja said the course was designed in such a manner that students who complete their fourth semester can write the second-level of examination – the intermediate examinations for CA, and can appear for the final exams at the end of the sixth semester.

“There are designated professors who will teach theory subjects and professional chartered accountants who will be adjunct faculty, teaching the practical application of your knowledge,” he said.

The course was designed with help from Chinnaswamy Ganesan of CNGSN and Associates LLP, Chennai.

Mr. Ganesan who was chief guest at the inauguration function, said that most students faced the dilemma of going to college or spending money for private CA classes. “Through this course, students will be able to attain top level commerce graduation and will be ready to face their CA exams at the end of their course. It also prepares them for further studies abroad. Being a chartered accountant is the highest professional course in the country. It can uplift an entire family,” he said.

Mr. Kannan said that the facilities available at the college like the Business Lab must be effectively utilised. It should be a space to debate ideas regarding business and should help students grow, he said.

He insisted that students should read business papers to gain a grasp of the subject.
